



## Information about your Medicare Coverage:

Medicare Part B pays for Occupational, Physical, and Speech therapy as long as it is medically necessary, but only up to the **yearly benefit limit of \$1810 for Occupational therapy and an additional \$1810 for combined Physical and Speech therapy**. Before the limits, you pay 20% of the Medicare approved amount after you have met your yearly deductible.

After you have reached the \$1810 cap, you will be responsible for 100% of the charge, unless you have other insurance coverage. This includes treatment, splints and any supplies covered by Medicare that your doctor has prescribed. The yearly cap is a **combined** benefit for all therapies you may receive over the course of the year, as noted above.

***There is no cap if you receive therapy at a hospital-based outpatient therapy department.*** If you have received prior Occupational, Physical or Speech therapy within the current year and are near or have reached the Medicare cap, we can refer you to a hospital therapy department so that your treatment may be covered. Your therapist may recommend referring you to a hospital therapy department if your treatment costs are anticipated to be higher than the Medicare cap due to the extent of your injury.
